2019/20 Manchester Met Student Support Packages for Full-Time New Students

Full Time Student Support Package (SSP):

To be eligible to receive SSP a student **must** have:

- Enrolled on an eligible undergraduate degree – fees **£9,250** or
- Enrolled on Year 1 of a foundation year course – fees **£9,250**
- **A UK Student Support Number.**
- Full financial assessment from Student Finance – student and sponsor must have **consented to share** information with Manchester Met.
- A **household income** no greater than **£25,000**.

Students could receive **£750** per year of full time study (providing they remain on their course).

Academic Achievement Bursary (AAB):

Students can receive **£1,000** in their first year of undergraduate study with Manchester Met (providing they remain on their course).

To be eligible to receive AAB you **must meet all the criteria**:

- Be a **new Manchester Met student** commencing **Year 1** of your 3 (or 4) year degree in the 2019/20 academic year.
- Have been assessed as a Home or EU student for fee purposes.
- Have applied via the UCAS main cycle, and not via UCAS Clearing or UCAS adjustment.
- Commencing Year 1 of an **eligible course**.
- Have been selected for the Manchester Met Unconditional Offer Scheme.
- **Made Manchester Met your firm choice in main cycle for 2019 entry.**
- Paying tuition fees under the **higher tuition fee regime - £9,250**.
- Course of study is **not** externally funded (e.g. through the NHS).
- Have achieved AAB at A Level (or equivalent).
- Have achieved certain GCSE grade(s) see below for details.
